
IELTS is accepted by over 9,000 organisations in over 135 countries. These include:




IELTS BAND SCORES AND TEST FORMAT

The IELTS test assesses your abilities in all four skills - listening, reading, writing and speaking - in under three hours.

The IELTS test format is tried and trusted by organisations and test takers worldwide, and has not changed significantly for over 20 years. You will take the Listening, Reading and Writing tests all on the same day one after the other, with no breaks in between them.

They are always taken in this order. Your Speaking test will either be after a break on the same day as the other three tests, or up to 3 days before or after that. This will depend on your test centre.




IELTS TEST SCORE GUIDANCE FOR EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

The level of English needed for a non-native speaker student to perform effectively varies by situation and institution.

That is why each individual institution should set its own minimum IELTS score for applicants, depending on specific institutional and programme requirements.

TWO VERSIONS OF THE TEST

There are two versions of the IELTS test. Everyone takes the same Listening and Speaking test, regardless of which version they take.

The Reading and Writing tests differ in content, depending on whether candidates are taking IELTS Academic or IELTS General Training.

IELTS Academic and IELTS General Training are assessed at exactly the same levels.

WHICH VERSION OF IELTS IS RIGHT FOR YOUR INSTITUTION?

IELTS is the four-skills test that has become the world's most popular English language proficiency test. IELTS offers a choice of two versions, to serve both academic and non-academic purposes. The format each version takes has remained consistent since 1995. You can select the version that best suits the needs of your organisation.

Even though there are two versions of the test, admission to undergraduate and postgraduate courses is based on the results of the Academic test.

IELTS PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMME

The British Council IELTS Partnership Programme is a partnership scheme for organisations that register for IELTS with the British Council. It is designed to show appreciation for the support that your institution offers us.

There are three levels of membership – **Silver, Gold and Platinum**.

The membership status is reviewed at the end of the year and the level confirmed is dependent on the number of candidates members have registered with the British Council.

The benefits accumulate as you move up the levels, enabling a long-term mutuallybeneficial relationship between your organisation and the British Council.

The membership thresholds are:

- **Silver:** associates providing 10-60 candidates per year
- Gold: associates providing 61-200 candidates per year
- Platinum: associates providing 201+ or more candidates per year.
- **1.** A year is measured from April to March
- **2.** Candidates gain access to Road to IELTS only once they have completed registration procedures.
- **3.** You can reserve seats up until six weeks before a test date.
- **4.** We will provide your certificate three months after signing an IELTS Partnership Programme contract with you.
- **5.** You will be able to use the strapline(s) once the contract is signed and the membership status is confirmed.
- **6.** We will distribute promotional materials as far as possible based on your requirements, but also on stock availability.
